# Sir John Holland (1914 -), Civil Engineer, Company Director

Birth & Family: Born 21 June 1914, Clifton Hill, Victoria; Clifton Vaughan Holland. Eighth child of Tom Holland, farmer and property owner, and Mabel Ruth Elizabeth (nee Falkingham) property owner (m 1892). Siblings (ages at birth of John): Harry (21), Tas (19), Rena (14), Florence (Bill) (12), Travers (5), Albert (4), and Clarice (3) then followed Ian (Jim) (1915), Alma (1917).

Attended Primary school at Flinders State School, No. 841, Secondary school at Frankston High School, Victorian Matriculation Certificate 1932. Tertiary education at University of Melbourne, Queens College.

In 1942 married Emily Joan Atkinson, they had three sons and one daughter.

# **Detailed Work History:**

Clifton Vaughan Holland, always known as John, had a life long passion to be an engineer. He was inspired by pictures of the Sydney Harbour Bridge and by the local Flinders Shire Engineer who allowed him to accompany him on various civil engineering projects. The Great Depression prevented Holland's attendance at a private school, but he excelled at Frankston High School prior to being accepted into Melbourne University in 1933 to pursue his engineering studies. He later boarded at Queen's College.

Following graduation Holland quickly received work with BP Australia. War service interrupted his burgeoning career as a civil engineer and he again excelled in this field of endeavour. He was active in the military engineering school and went on to play a vital role in the Z special force. While on active service he contemplated his future direction and decided that he wished to establish his own engineering business. He did this on demobilisation, joining Stafford Fox in a partnership to form the John Holland Construction Group.

The business prospered and won contracts to work on hundreds of projects Australia wide. Key projects included: Jindabyne Pumping Station, Captain Cook Bridge, Loy Yang Power Station, Calcap Thermal Power Station Queensland, Westgate Bridge, Tasman Bridge Restoration, National Animal Health Laboratory Geelong, Sydney Entertainment Centre, Australian Sports Institute, MCG Great Southern Stand, South Eastern Freeway, Coal Outloading Facilities Mackay, and Joint Construction Manager New Parliament House Canberra
