## I.A.G.S.D.C. NEWSLETTER DEC '86

#### Report from the Chairman

The weeks have sped by since our first letter in September. It has been a time for catching one's breath from the Convention and focusing in on some local square dance activities as well as some personal ones. Nonetheless there has been a lot of activity on the IAGSDC 'front' which this newsletter will bring you up to date on. Here goes:

#### 1) ADVERTISING

I sent off our first IAGSDC ad to the National Square Dance Directory fashioned along the lines of the ads for some 20 other associations and a few days later received a letter from Mississippi where they are located. My immediate thought was that they were returning the ad with a refusal to print; however, it was just a receipt! So look for us in the 1987 edition; we'll be there! I would like to thank Capital City Squares for advancing us the \$180.00 needed for the ad since the account at that time was not fully operational.

Garrett Peter is working with the Gay Games II people to obtain a copy of their extensive Gay media list, but it looks like it may take awhile to obtain. In the meantime, please continue to send any media leads to: Larry Kellogg, P.O. Box 7117, Sacramento, CA. 95826. Of particular interest would be copies of the Gay press from non-square dance cities so that we can spread the word. Tim Kimmel of the 'Hoosier Hoedowners' responded to this request by forwarding a copy of the "Gayellow Pages, The National Edition". This directory is quite extensive; it has many publications listed. We can put Larry to work right away; it lists many national organizations. I've written to the Homosexual Information Center and the International Gay and Lesbian Archives in Los Angeles, The Institute of Social Ethics in lartford, CT., The Lavendar Archives in Philadelphia, PA. and the International Gay History Archive in NY, NY; and it lists individual city resources - I've written to get the particulars for listing the Association as well as each club. Thanks, Tim!

#### 2) THE BANNER DANCE

The Banner Dance is each club hosting a fundraiser for the IAGSDC. It can be a regular club or class night or special hoedown or whatever. Profits made are divided three ways: 1/3 to IAGSDC; 1/3 to Portland to be used in reducing registration fees; and 1/3 to the club itself to be used for promoting attendance at the Convention. Collectively, the monies raised will make a difference. Beyond raising funds, we will be also be raising group spirit and Convention enthusiasm.

Western Star Dancers will host the first Banner Dance on January 28, 1987. This is our regular club night and we plan to show Art Smith's and Mike Healy's San Francisco Convention Video and to dance to the MS tip portion of Art's tape — which is just one example of the "Banner Dance". We would like all clubs to participate from February thru May. Please pick your first and second choice of date and let me know by mid-January. I will try to coordinate so that the IAGSDC banner has an easy travel itinerary. Let's put it together!!
