

Included are Legacy, Callerlab, United Square Dancers of America, and Single Square Dancers of America; this year for the first time, the IAGSDC has been invited to attend. The meeting takes place the day before the Convention officially begins, and should be a very interesting affair. I feel that any dialogue between us and the straight square dance world will eventually help combat the homophobia that is occasionally present when our two groups get together.

Another event that is part of the 41st National is their Hall of Ideas — where many clubs and groups have informational materials and displays. We have applied for space in the Hall of Ideas, and are currently in the process of creating an attractive and informational table top display that will feature photos of gay and lesbian dancers. Production is also underway for the design of a tri-fold brochure which will contain more pictures and information about the IAGSDC and the member clubs.

If you have any pictures of dances, conventions, parades, etc. that are interesting in content and include printed signs or a recognizable landmark, building or site that will illustrate the idea that "we are everywhere, and we square dance!", please send the photo or the negative to me. Just remember that it will be seen by thousands of straight dancers in Cincinnati. There will be space for many photos, so PLEASE look through your archives, and tell your members to look through their photos. We hope that all areas of the country will be included. Call me if you have questions at (212) 580-8785, or use the 800 number that appears in the ad. We need these photos as soon as possible, as we must start printing the display piece and the brochure in April or early May.

The brochure will also contain some pictures and will be appropriate for us to send out to people who are trying to get square dancing started in other communities. A rough layout of the brochure is included as part of this newsletter.

Someone must be at the display during the hours that the area is open for the attendees to browse through. WE NEED VOLUNTEERS to be there to hand out brochures and answer questions. It is nonly a great way to spread the word about Lesbian and Gay involvement in the square dance world, its a great way to break down the homophobia.

Enclosed are registration forms. Please try to get someone from your club to attend, it is very important that we make an impact. We will dance in same sex squares and as same sex couples, as well as find partners in the singles hall. It is important that we have lots of people there. Bring your Club Shirts and IAGSDC Convention badges. Lets show them how to WEAVE THE RING!!!!! There has been a bit of homophobic "attitude" from the management of the National concerning our display and brochure, and our request to run the ad in National Squares. This makes it even MORE important for as many dancers as possible from the IAGSDC Clubs to attend. PLEASE GET THIS INFORMATION TO YOUR BOARD MEMBERS AND THE MEMBERS OF YOUR CLUB.

There will be lots of dancing and it should be lof fun. Many IAGSDC club members currently dance with straight groups at regional conventions and at local dances. This will be the *first* time that we become visible in a major way at a *National* and the more dancers we can get there, the better it will be.

The convention is the weekend before Albuquerque, so start your vacation in Ohio, then trek on down to New Mexico for the week at DIAMONDS IN THE DESERT to round out a week long cross cultural square dance event that you will remember forever!!

KEEPING TRACK OF THE BANNER


