



# **Specialty Tips**

Specialty Tips are set up for those who share a common interest in an area outside of square dancing, or who like a specialized type of calling. The following is a description of the pre-scheduled Specialty Tips.

**Women's Tips** (Friday, 7 pm and Sunday, 5 pm) - For those self-identified as women. Everyone welcome. Hosted by The Women of Desert Valley Squares and T-Squares. Called by a cooperative effort of The Women of the Gay Callers Association.

**Bears** (Friday 8:30 pm) - For those of hairy disposition and/or large girth, and their admirers. Bare chests recommended.

**Munchkin** (Sunday 2:00 pm) - For people of short stature, under 5 foot 6 inches (170 cm).

**Redwood** (Sunday 3:00 pm) - For tall people over 5 foot 7 inches (180 cm).

**Medallion Tip & Photo** (Saturday 8 pm) - In honor of recipients of the 10- and 20- year medallion. The first tip will be for this year's recipients only (and as many as needed to fill in the last square). A photograph of all 10-year medallion recipients will be taken during this time.

**Moonshine** (Saturday 10 pm) - (Un)dress code required, footwear recommended for your safety. No alcohol, no photography, no entry after doors close (@ 10:10), bags checked at door.

**Move-On** (Friday 3:00 pm) - Enjoy the magic as the caller directs the dancers to progress from one square to another, around the room, and end up back at home.

**Leather** (Saturday 8:30 pm) - Leather dress code recommended. Major piece of leather or rubber equivalent (e.g. pants, chaps, vest, harness) or disciplined services uniform requested but not required.

**Bring Your Own Specialty Tip** (Sunday 9, 10, & 11 am) – These times are not scheduled, but are available for you to program your own Specialty Tip. Use the Announcements Bulletin Board in the Conference Center Lobby to claim and announce your time, and find a GCA Member caller to volunteer to call.

# **Special Events**

**Caller School Dance** (Thursday 2:00 pm) - These are the students of the GCA caller school held Monday - Wednesday. Students may range from fairly experienced callers getting a review of their calling techniques, to beginners who first picked up a microphone Monday.

**Grand March & Opening Ceremonies** (Friday 4:00 pm) – The official opening of convention. You will gather with your club in the Arizona Biltmore Ballroom, march in groups of four to the Frank Lloyd Wright Ballroom, then follow a Grand March Marshal, who will lead you to the right place. You will be outside for approximately 2-3 minutes during the walk from building to building.

**Honky Tonk Queen Contest** (Friday 10:00 pm) – A beauty pageant of sorts. We use the word beauty very loosely. An annual tradition. Open Seating in the Frank Lloyd Wright Ballroom. Doors open approximately 30 minutes before the show begins.

**Two-Step & Country/Western Dance** (Saturday night) – Two-stepping and line dancing for both experienced dancers and beginners.

Contra Dance (Sunday 6:00 pm) – Much of what we do in Modern Western Square Dancing has its roots in other dance forms, including Contra dancing, an original American Folk Dance. Enjoy this 3-hour special event featuring Round The House, a live four-piece band from Tucson, AZ, and callers Chris Ricciotti and Laura Johannes of the Boston Uncommons in Massachusetts, Claire Zucker, who is a member of the band, and possibly others.

**Fun Badge Tour** (Monday morning) - A city tour with dancing at various locations

# Workshops

No Holds Barred, Take No Prisoners (Sunday 4:00 pm) - For experienced dancers at their most proficient program. Callers will call difficult material or moderately hard material at full dance speed. As long as one square is alive, callers are not to lower the difficulty level. Please dance at the level where you are most proficient so that this hour is successful for everyone. Many dancers choose to drop down a level for this hour!

Introduction to Next Program (Saturday 2:00 pm) - For experienced dancers of their existing program, who would like to learn some calls and concepts from the next level. Please continue to dance in the hall for your existing level. Intro to Plus will be in the Mainstream hall. Intro to Advanced will be in the Plus hall. Etc.

**Showcase and other featured Callers -** These are experienced non-staff callers invited by the convention programming committee to call at the convention. You'll hear and dance to these callers at 9:00 on Saturday and Sunday mornings.

GCA Callers - These are members of the Gay Callers Association, who will start most hours with a 10-minute tip while staff callers are changing halls. Many of these callers will have a fair degree of experience. Please refer to the GCA Caller Schedule included in your registration packet.

### Meetings

IAGSDC™ Delegates (Friday 8:00 am) – Each IAGSDC™ member organization sends a delegate and an alternate delegate to this meeting where most of the business of the Association is handled.

**AA Meetings** (11 AM Fri. & Sat., 3 PM Sun.) – A one-hour meeting is scheduled each day. Please note that the location changes on Sunday.

**SMART (Self Management And Recovery Training) Meetings** (10 AM Fri. & Sat.,2 PM Sun.) bring science and reason to self-help groups for addictive behaviors involving alcohol, drugs, and anger, etc. Some people attend SMART meetings and AA meetings, finding parts of each approach they can use on their own road to recovery.

**Club Development** (Friday 1:00 PM – Prescott) - This meeting is for those individuals who are interested in forming a new club, or are in the process of forming a club and would like input and suggestions from the Club Development Committee and existing clubs.

It will be a relaxed format where information and ideas can be shared and to discuss problems that new clubs have been dealing with.

**Town Hall Meeting** (Friday 2:30 PM – Prescott) - The Town Hall Meeting is a feedback meeting that individual club members can come to and express issues that they are having, either in their own clubs or as members of the association. Though it would be nice to have an open discussion, there maybe time limits on discussions so the issues can be worked on over the next year.

**All Join Hand Foundation Seminar** (Sunday 2:30 PM – Prescott Room) – All Join Hands Foundation invites you to a free seminar entitled **Charitable Giving 101** presented by Ken Kildad. Ken is a Financial Advisor with Merrill Lynch who specializes in assisting private individuals and business-owners in managing their complex financial needs – including investment consulting, retirement planning and estate planning just to name a few.

All Join Hands Foundation, Ltd, is a nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting the funding of projects that will preserve and promote Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgendered (GLBT) square dancing and other associated dance forms. The projects will protect the heritage of the activity and contribute to its growth, emphasizing the social, physical, and mental benefits of square dancing. All Join Hands Foundation will also increase public awareness, educate and inform the general public about preserving the art of square dancing, educating the public on GLBT square dancers, and educate the public about square dancing as an art form.

#### 2003-04 Highlights

April 21, 2004: All Join Hands Foundation announced the funding of a FREE Trail-In Dance open to everyone in Phoenix, Arizona, on July 1, 2004. The dance will be held at the Arizona Biltmore Resort featuring callers Tony Oxendine, Mike DeSisto, and Randy Dougherty. All Join Hands Foundation hopes to bridge the gaps in the square dance community and create a new future for square dancing.

February 29, 2004: All Join Hands Foundation approved funding for the GCA caller school in Phoenix, AZ, June 28-30, 2004. The callers school sold out within days of the announcement.

January 1, 2004: All Join Hands Foundation donors met the two challenge grants made in July, 2003 by donating over \$10,000 to the Foundation. We received the full \$10,000 in matching funds.

November, 2003: All Join Hands Foundation funded the production and mailing of the November IAGSDC newsletter.

October 4, 2003: All Join Hands Foundation donated two additional travelling displays to the IAGSDC. One will remain in Canada and the second will join the original display in travelling around the United States.




