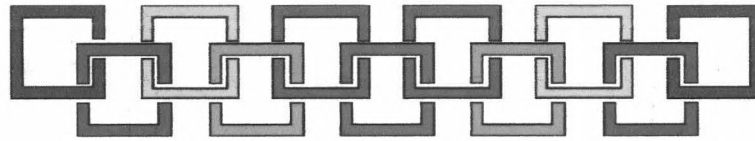

Current 2009 room and sales tax is 15.4%.

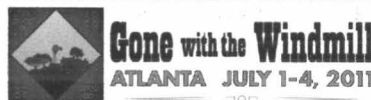
