

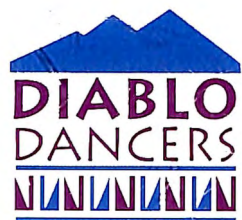

Our Featured Speaker

State Senator Mark Leno

Mark Leno was elected to the California Senate in 2008. He currently represents the 11th Senate District of California, which includes San Francisco, Broadmoor, Colma, Daly City and portions of South San Francisco. Senator Leno chairs the Senate Budget and Fiscal Review Committee.

Senator Leno was the first openly gay man elected to the California Senate and one of the first two openly gay men (along with John Laird) to serve in the State Assembly.

From 2002-2008, Senator Leno served in the California State Assembly, representing the 13th District, which encompasses the eastern portion of San Francisco. Prior to his election to the Assembly, he served for four and a half years on the San Francisco Board of Supervisors between after being appointed by then-Mayor Willie Brown.

A native of Wisconsin, Senator Leno attended the University of Colorado at Boulder, then went on to become valedictorian of his graduating class at the American College of Jerusalem, where he earned his Bachelor of Arts Degree. He also spent two years in Rabbinical Studies at The Hebrew Union College in New York.

Senator Leno is the owner of Budget Signs, Inc., a small business he founded in 1978 and operated with his life partner, Douglas Jackson. Together, the two entrepreneurs steadily grew their sign business until Jackson passed away from complications relating to HIV/AIDS in 1990. This deep loss would not deter Leno. Instead, he redoubled his efforts in community service.

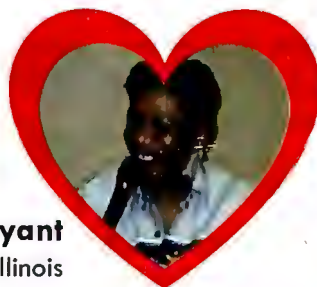
During his tenure in the Legislature, Senator Leno has fought for better schools and access to higher education, foster youth, a cleaner and sustainable environment, single-payer universal health care, improved transportation, renewable energy, safer streets and equal rights for all Californians.

Featured Entertainers



Joy Anagnostis (C&W Dance) is a Country & Western dance instructor and DJ. Her monthly OutWest Dance events in Sebastopol, CA create a fun and welcoming atmosphere for everyone, especially the LGBTQ community. She lives in Sebastopol with her partner Lisa.



Barbary Coast Cloggers (C&W Dance) are a performance group who have delighted audiences with their rowdy, upbeat take on traditional Appalachian dancing since 1981, when they split off from the groups that later became Western Star Dancers and Foggy City Dancers. They teach and perform in the San Francisco Bay Area.



Big Lou, the Accordion Princess (Family Reunion Picnic) entertains at Oktoberfests, weddings, birthday parties, anniversaries, romantic dinners a deux, and (sadly) funerals. In addition to her solo career, she has led groups including the infamous Polkacide, Those Darn Accordions, Big Lou's Polka Casserole, International House of Accordions, and Big Lou's Dance Party, playing swing, C&W, waltzes, polkas, cha-chas and dance styles that haven't even got names.



CHEER SF (Opening Ceremony) is an adult cheerleading team whose mission is to raise money for organizations serving people with HIV/AIDS and other life-challenging conditions. Since 1980, CHEER SF has been thrilling crowds with its unique brand of extreme stunts and high-energy dance routines. This all-volunteer group provides polished, professional entertainment while serving as ambassadors of goodwill to the communities in which they serve.

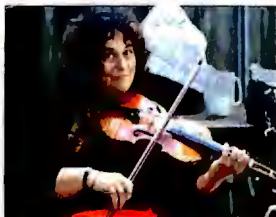
Featured Entertainers



Emeryville Taiko (Opening Ceremony) is a San Francisco Bay Area taiko group providing traditional Japanese drumming classes and performances. Taiko drumming is an exciting modern artform with ancient roots in the religious ceremonies and folk festivals of Japan. It has experienced a worldwide renaissance that began in the 60s and continues to grow today. Emeryville Taiko started as an Oakland taiko class for children by Yuri Morita and Susan Horn under the guidance of Grand Master Seiichi Tanaka, founder of San Francisco Taiko Dojo.



Marilynn Fowler (Opening Ceremony MC) is an actress and a deejay at San Francisco noncommercial community radio station KPOO-FM 89.5, where she hosts a blues show "The Power of Blues Compels You" on Mondays from 9am to noon and an interview show, "Let Me Touch Your Mind", on Mondays at noon. She's also a talented freelance designer (see her work at www.vicesbyproxy.com) and dances with Western Star Dancers.



Shira Kammen, James MacQueen, and Patti Cobb (Contra Dance) are well-known musicians in the Bay Area's lively traditional music scene.

Shira Kammen (fiddle) has spent well over half her life exploring the worlds of early and traditional music. She currently performs with a medieval ensemble, Fortune's Wheel; a new music group, Ephemeris; an eclectic ethnic band, Panacea; and frequently collaborates with performers in theatrical and dance productions.

James MacQueen (fiddle) is a young virtuoso violinist and composer, recently graduated from the University of the Pacific.

Patti Cobb (keyboards) is a vocalist and multi-instrumentalist, currently a member of the acoustic rock trio Tonal Recall and the rock project Slanted House

James and Patti make up one half of the local contra dance band StringFire.



Featured Entertainers



Amanda King (Sunday Brunch) is a classic chanteuse who performs jazz standards and popular songs from the Great American Songbook. This talented young performer has appeared in cabaret venues, music festivals, and musical theatre performances throughout the San Francisco Bay Area.



Lesbian/Gay Chorus of San Francisco (Opening Ceremony) is the nation's oldest self-identified LGBT mixed chorus. Since its first concert over 30 years ago, the LGCSF has performed around the world, and hundreds of times in San Francisco. The Chorus provides a forum for San Francisco's gay and lesbian music lovers to develop their talents, find good friends, and share their gifts with San Francisco's diverse communities.



Tom Orr (Saturday Banquet) bills himself as "San Francisco's musical comedy porn star". After starring in smart, swanky and scandalous parodies of legendary nightclub acts with titles like *Dirty Little Showtunes*, *The Devil Wears Nada* and *A Crass Act*. Tom has set his sights on a new array of sacred cows, including gay marriage and gay pride itself, in his latest musical travesty, *Aging Bull*, or *40 is the New 10*.



ARE YOU READY FOR THE NEW INVESTMENT LANDSCAPE?
