HOW TO TENDER

Why is taking a shuttle boat from the ship to shore called a “tender”? That’s a question only JOCOBOT 3000 can answer. But here’s the scoop on getting there and back again.

- When we reach Half Moon Cay, there will be an announcement telling you to assemble if you’re ready to go ashore.
 - If you previously signed up for a shore excursion, you’ll be given special instructions on where and when to meet.
