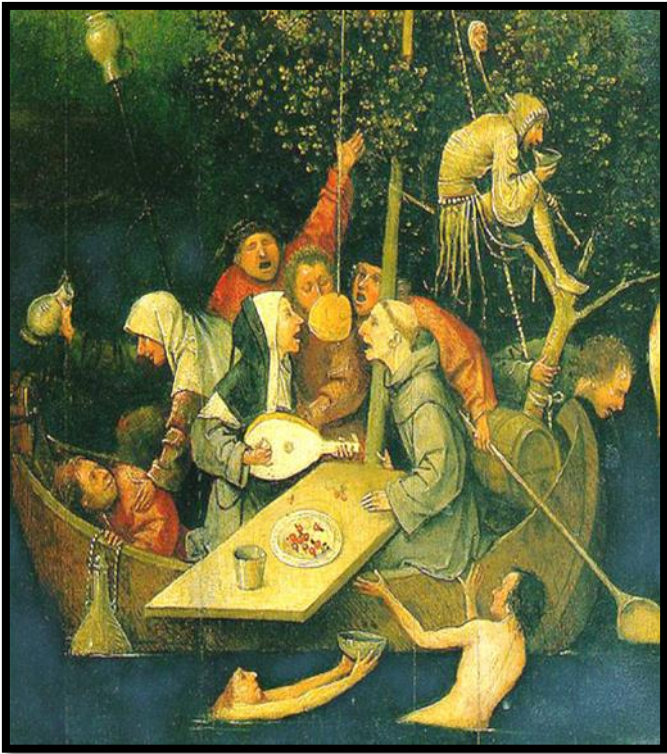
STORMOSCOPES

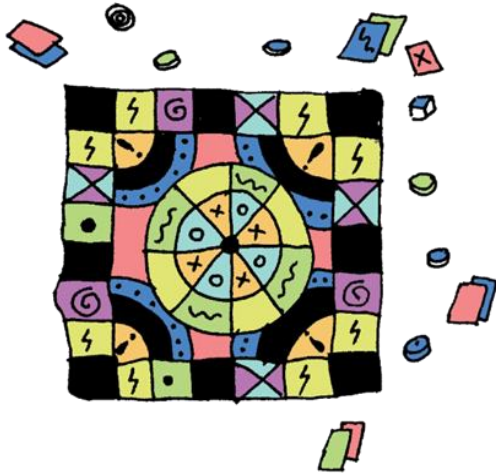
