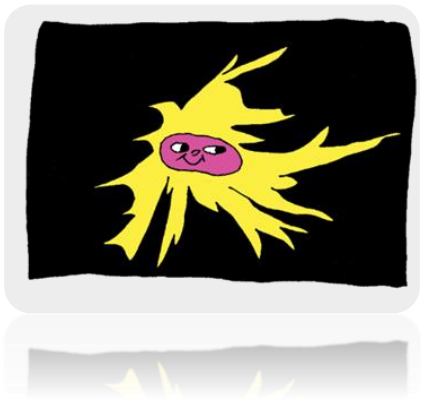

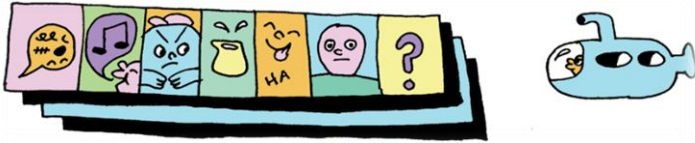
DAY 6: TOP TEN PAJAMAS

CONSERVATION FUND

We encourage all Sea Monkeys to join us in donating to The Conservation Fund’s Upper Ouachita carbon-verified reforestation! Donations will be used to purchase trees in the 2011 planting, which have already been sequestering carbon for 8 years.

Once those supplies are sold, donations will go to 2019 and 2020 plantings. Upper Ouachita is the largest ongoing floodplain restoration project in the United States; Louisiana’s Ouachita River stretches more than 42,500 acres over the Lower Mississippi River Valley.



Every \$20 donated covers the cost of planting two trees, but given the immediacy of the climate crisis, we recommend planting 4-5 trees (\$40-50) for every metric tonne of carbon you anticipate emitting on your way to JoCo Cruise 2020.

By 2030, JoCo Cruise’s initial donation of \$10,000 to The Conservation Fund will sequester carbon to offset all its 2019 and 2020 internal event air travel emissions, plus additional sequestration that will accrue after 2030. JoCo Cruise is also offsetting its 2019 and 2020 marine fuel emissions through the purchase of additional high-quality offset types.

The Conservation Fund is one of the highest ranked conservation non-profits in America. Donations to this campaign will be directed to Upper Ouachita plantings; more than 96% of every dollar donated will go directly to purchasing carbon offsets.
