

The Libertarian Party of New York mourns the passing of Edward Emerson "Ed" Clark, the LPNY founding chair and a trailblazer for the modern liberty movement. Clark, who passed away on June 19, 2025, at the age of 95, leaves behind a legacy as one of the most influential early figures in the party's history.

Clark's journey with the Libertarian movement began in 1971,

when he left the Republican Party in response to President Richard Nixon's wage and price controls, a moment that galvanized many who would go on to shape the Libertarian Party. When the New York Free Libertarian Party was organized in 1972, Clark was the first State Chair, helping lay the groundwork for what would become one of the party's most enduring affiliates.

After his time in New York, Clark moved west, where he continued to shape the Libertarian Party on a national scale. He was elected Vice-Chair of the Libertarian National Committee in 1972 and later served as State Chair of the Libertarian Party of California. In 1978, he made headlines running for Governor of California, earning 377,960 votes-5.46% of the vote-a record for a Libertarian gubernatorial candidate that still stands. Two years later, Clark carried the party's banner as its 1980 presidential nominee alongside running mate David Koch, earning over 920,000 votes

nationwide and cementing the Libertarian Party's status as a credible national force.

Beyond his campaigns, Clark will be remembered for his calm, professional demeanor and his ability to communicate libertarian principles to new audiences, often describing libertarianism as "low-tax" liberalism" to reach voters across the spectrum. His 1980 campaign sparked the creation of Students for Clark groups nationwide, inspired countless activists, and brought libertarian ideas—tax reduction, deregulation, civil liberties, and nonintervention abroad—into the national conversation.

Ed Clark's pioneering efforts as the founding Chair of the Libertarian

Party of New York and his groundbreaking national campaigns helped shape the trajectory of the party. We honor his contributions and his role in giving our party, in New York and across the country, a strong foundation to build upon.

2025 Candidates

We have at least two candidates on the ballot this year, Matthew Morgan, running for New York City Council. In Syracuse, the Onondaga County Libertarian Party has cross-endorsed Thomas Babilon for Mayor, who is running on the Republcian line.

MATTHEW MORGAN WINS SPOT ON BALLOT

Brooklyn, NY -- The Kings County Supreme Court ordered that Matthew Morgan of the Brooklyn Libertarian Party, and the Libertarian candidate for New York City Council District 39, be placed back on the ballot this week. Morgan was removed from the ballot by the Board of Elections in the City of New York in June due to a cover sheet error. Honorary Judge Lawrence Knipel found that the Board of Elections had erred in its decision to remove Morgan from the ballot for his defective cover sheet, and that he had shown substantial compliance with state election laws and had made no errors worthy of disqualification. Matthew Morgan will therefore be

on the ballot for the November 4,

2025 General Election. He was previously on the ballot for the 2021 General Election, running for the same position against the same candidates. Morgan is campaigning on the same issues now as he was then: building more housing, abolishing zoning, saving small businesses, reforming the police department, removing ICE, and promoting a more environmentally friendly, pedestrian-oriented, and alternative transportation-focused city.

When he is not campaigning, Morgan has spent the past half-decade in various leadership roles in service organizations such as Rotary International, as well as in local mutual aid and immigrant outreach groups.

"I believe that my experience and



expertise working in the private sector and within numerous service organizations have uniquely qualified me to be the strongest candidate in this race. I know the neighborhood, I know the neighbors, I know the struggles, and I know how we can improve the district and improve the city. I look forward to sharing those ideas and solutions in the coming months leading up to the election."

HELP US GET A02724 AND S01870 PASSED

These bills, if passed would lower the ballot access thresholds back to the previous standards: the number of votes needed to get ballot access to 50,000 (from 130,000 or 2%), and lower the petition signature requirement for a statewide office to 15,000 (from 45,000).
