PARTY HISTORICAL PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

MEETING SUMMARY May 6, 2025

Date and Time: Tuesday, 6 May 2025 at 4:30pm Mountain time

Where: Online: Zoom

Committee Attendees: Caryn Ann Harlos, Joe Dehn, James Gholston, Sam Bohler, Andrew Kolstee

Other Attendees: Michael Chastain, Paul Darr

The meeting was called to order at 4:35pm Mountain time.

Guest Comments: Michael Chastain commented on updates he had been making about candidates, and his interest in learning from recent campaigns how much it takes to win an office. Paul Darr advised the committee that the headquarters building is likely to sell quickly so that if there are things there that we want to save we should be ready to move them soon.

Storing/Shipping Material from Headquarters: Caryn Ann estimated that there might be 15 boxes worth of material involved. There was discussion of activists in the general area who might be able to help, including possibly storing the material temporarily until it can be shipped elsewhere. Caryn Ann reported on progress in covering a significant portion of the cost of the Colorado storage unit with donations.

Records of Previous Meetings: The minutes of the 1 April meeting were approved without objection. *Note: The meeting scheduled for 15 April did not take place.*

General LPedia: Caryn Ann asked that committee members review the "Getting Started as a Contributor" article to see if it needs updating.

Templates: In response to a question about why file links are being directed to Google, Andrew explained that this is a temporary workaround for the issue of files being being downloaded instead of displayed.



Categories: In response to a question about numbers that have started appearing on the category pages; it was explained that these are just counts of items and subcategories. Caryn Ann said she was trying to catch up on her category project.

Site Technical: There was brief discussion of the problem of file information pages not showing the pages that reference them; this may be part of the same problem as download vs. display. Sam will follow up with MyWikis to try to get this resolved.

Facebook Live Videos: Andrew reported that Facebook announced that they will be deleting "live" videos; going forward new live videos will be deleted after 30 days and already existing ones will also be deleted over time. He noted that in some cases this may be the only place that some videos, e.g., candidate statements, were posted. He said that he has already started downloading some of these relating to national and New York activities, and that it is pretty straightforward to do the downloading, but he is looking for advice on how to locate and prioritize the downloading of others.
