Mr. Chair,

It is with great pleasure that I write to you to formally seek an affiliation relationship between The Granite State Libertarian Party and The Libertarian National Committee. The GSLP is an organization that has formed organically, composed of long-time libertarian activists, Libertarian Party leadership, and volunteers in New Hampshire, who have endeavored to continue the work of the party, independent of the former affiliate, for many reasons.

While our group has been organizing unofficially since 2024, when we helped secure ballot access in New Hampshire for Libertarian Party Presidential Nominee, Chase Oliver, following the disaffiliation of the former Libertarian Party of New Hampshire this year, we decided to organize a formal structure and begin operating as a political party that Libertarians could be proud to support in the freest state in the union. Following a successful petition drive, to once again secure ballot access for a Libertarian candidate in New Hampshire, Granite State Libertarians held an organizational convention on August 30th, to adopt and ratify bylaws, and elect our inaugural executive committee.

The credentialed delegates at our inaugural convention included multiple former LNC members, Multiple former and current Elected Libertarian Office holders, as well as the surviving founding board members of The Libertarian Party of New Hampshire who have been the long time stalwarts of this party, since the 1970s.

Before adjourning business, our delegates proposed, and passed unanimously, a resolution to instruct our newly elected Executive Committee to formally seek affiliation with the Libertarian Party, and to fill the vacancy left in New Hampshire, ensuring that Granite State Libertarians have a political home moving forward.
