

LURA B. KEAN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IS THE SCHOOL OF TOMORROW-TODAY. PLANNING BEGUN BY YOUR SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION AND THE BOARD OF EDUCATION IN 1964 HAS RESULTED IN ONE OF THE MOST FLEXIBLE, FORWARD-LOOKING
SCHOOL PLANTS IN THE COUNTRY. EVERY SCHOOL BUILDING SHOULD HAVE THE FLEXIBILITY TO PROVIDE AN ENVIRONMENT SUITABLE FOR ANY CONCEIVABLE KIND OF EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITY: INDIVIDUALIZED INSTRUCTION; LARGE AND
SMALL GROUP INSTRUCTION; MUSIC, ART, AND SCIENCE ACTIVITY AREAS; CONFERENCE AND LIBRARY AREAS; SHARED
AREAS FOR TEAM TEACHING; SEPARATED SPACE FOR INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC INSTRUCTION AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION;
INDEPENDENT STUDY OR LEARNING LABORATORY SPACE; AND HOME ROOM OR HOME GROUP AREA WHERE BOOKS AND SUPPLIES
ARE KEPT AND WHERE STUDENTS WILL SPEND A MAJOR PORTION OF THE INSTRUCTIONAL TIME OF THE SCHOOL DAY.

THE TWO CLUSTERS OF FOUR HEXAGONAL SPACES, EACH OPENING INTO A SHARED STUDY AREA THROUGH OPERABLE WALLS OR GLASS PARTITIONS, PROVIDE AN ENVIRONMENTAL FEELING OF FREEDOM AND SPACIOUSNESS WHILE ALSO ALLOWING FOR THE PROXIMITY OF OTHER TEACHERS AND GROUPS OF CHILDREN FOR INTERCLASS GROUPINGS OR TEAM TEACHING.

CHILDREN WILL MOVE FROM ONE LEARNING AREA TO ANOTHER; AND TO FACILITATE THEIR MOVEMENT, PORTABLE, DRAWER-LIKE PLASTIC TOTE TRAYS HAVE BEEN PROVIDED WITH WHICH TO CARRY THEIR BOOKS AND SUPPLIES TO THE NEW LOCA-TION.

EDUCATORS, ARCHITECTS, AND NEWSPAPER MEN THROUGHOUT OHIO HAVE SHOWN HIGH INTEREST IN LURA B. KEAN SCHOOL. THESE VISITORS STATE THAT WOOSTER'S NEWEST SCHOOL IS ONE OF THE FINEST AND EDUCATIONALLY SOUND SCHOOL DESIGNS IN THE COUNTRY TODAY.

IN THIS MANNER, THE BOARD OF EDUCATION HOPES TO HONOR NOT ONLY MISS KEAN BUT ALSO ALL OF THE FACULTY MEMBERS WHO HAVE SERVED THE CHILDREN OF WOOSTER WITH COMPETENCE AND DEDICATION.

MISS LURA B. KEAN WAS BORN IN WAYNE COUNTY, OHIO. SHE ATTENDED SCHOOL IN WAYNE COUNTY AND COMPLETED HER BACHELOR OF PHILOSOPHY DEGREE FROM THE COLLEGE OF WOOSTER IN 1889.

BEFORE COMING TO THE WOOSTER CITY SCHOOLS, MISS KEAN TAUGHT IN MASSILLON, RICHWOOD, AND MIAMISBURG.

MISS KEAN CAME TO THE WOOSTER CITY SCHOOLS IN 1896 AND HELD THE POSITION OF PRINCIPAL UNTIL HER RETIREMENT IN 1931.

DURING THESE 35 YEARS SHE TOOK A VERY ACTIVE LEADERSHIP ROLE IN THE EDUCATION OF THE YOUTH OF THE WOOSTER COMMUNITY.

SHE ALSO WAS ACTIVE IN THE LOCAL, STATE, AND NATIONAL EDUCATION ORGANIZATIONS SERVING AS A MEMBER AND AN OFFICER IN THE WOOSTER EDUCATION ASSOCIATION, THE NORTHEAST OHIO TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION, AND THE NATIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATION.

MISS KEAN WAS ALSO ACTIVE IN CIVIC ORGANIZATIONS AND WAS A MEMBER OF THE METHODIST CHURCH IN WOOSTER.

MISS KEAN WAS STERN, FAIR, DEDICATED, AND COMPETENT IN THE FIELD OF EDUCATION; BUT MOST IMPORTANT, SHE WAS A CONCERNED FRIEND OF ALL THE YOUTH OF HER TIME.
